We continue his dream to help youth to rise to their full potential and to explore the extraordinary. Our accomplishments over the past years include the following:

 Conducted 9 college tours to such schools as Howard, Norfolk State,



Hampton, Tennessee State University, Fisk, University of Maryland, Meharry, Vanderbilt, and the University of Pennsylvania.

- Awarded over 40 Wallace Leeper Memorial Book Scholarships. College graduates have gone on to become teachers, engineers, and computer scientists. Others continue to pursue academic goals that will yield biology, education, and marketing careers.
- Presented math, science, and engineering career options and provided engineering literature to hundreds of students at career fairs, community events, job shadow days, college fairs, and other events.
- Served as student advocates for families where parents and/or grandparents were not knowledgeable about the college admissions process. Assisted youth with the preparation of financial aid

forms, college applications, college essays, and resumes.

- LEAP Forward was instrumental in bringing the Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) program to Calvert County, Maryland.
- Youth exposure to engineering programs by participating in engineering camps and conferences sponsored by National Society of Black Engineers, Society of Women Engineers and the Engineering Awards conference.
- Recruited and facilitated students to participate in Minority Introduction to Engineering programs and to pursue engineering. (Efforts yielded three professional minority engineers and three current college students pursuing engineering.)

LEAP Forward Participates In ASCE Workshop

LEAP Forward Board Member, Ms. Wilhemina Greene participated in a free workshop in Baltimore, MD sponsored by American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE). The Joint Engineering Training Workshop entitled "You Can Do It, Too! Taking Engineering to the Kids" discussed ways to encourage and to increase the number of students entering engineering disciplines. As part of the workshop, she participated as a team on several ex-

periments – ways to build a bridge using only pennies and paper and ways to purify dirty water. These experiments fostered the notion that engineering can be fun as well as solve problems. Methods were discussed on how to engage young students [even 1st graders] to look at how their everyday life is centered around the various engineering disciplines. Participants left the workshop with experiments and demonstrations for every age group and the

LEAP Forward members traveled to Lynchburg, VA to allow 5 young men and women to participate in the 2006 National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE) Jr. Region II Summer Camping Conference held at Eagle Eyrie Baptist Conference Center. Students who participated were Byron Pullen, Marco Holmes, Brittany Neighbors, Alyssa Greene and Aaron Ogletree. LEAP Forward also sponsored Patricia Vest (a math teacher from a Baltimore Middle School), Jeffrey Ellis and-Javon McPherson (Hart Middle School Washington, DC)

The Engineering Summer Camp is sponsored by NSBE and introduces youth to engineering and leadership principles. I am very grateful to be selected to participate in the Community Consulting Clinic (CCC) and for the opportunity to attend the National Black MBA conference in Atlanta, Georgia, on September 27th through October 1st, 2006 (at the financial expense of the DC Chapter!).

The CCC provides consulting services to current or aspiring entrepreneurs whose level of financial resources makes it difficult to solicit professional business advice. My participation in the CCC began in 2005. During that period, I was privileged to be under the mentorship of Lauren Beard who provided LEAP Forward strategic planning assistance.

The conference theme was "Winning with Intention, Winning with Innovation, and Winning with Integrity". This theme was so appropriate. It sums up my conference experience in that I was made to feel like a winner and inspired to stay the course to keep on winning.

Though I have attended professional conferences before, there was something different about this one. Clearly, this is a financially sound organization and the quality of the workshops, speakers, and

entertainment were indicative of that fact. Scheduled events fostered a spirit of empowerment and I took advantage of the opportunity to participate fully in conference activities offered.

All in attendance were all about business and eager to learn and grow. Meeting the DC Chapter Leaders of Tomorrow and learning of their dreams and aspirations

This program provided the much-needed financial resources that allowed her to reach her educational goals. Upon graduation, Rhonda conducted and managed major defense systems test and evaluation programs. Her career advanced rapidly as she took advantage of numerous accelerated and executive training opportunities. She is a certified PMI project management professional and currently serves as a project

engineer for n u m e r o u s aviation research and development initiatives at the Federal Aviation Administration in Washington, DC.

As a community conscious citizen, Rhonda led

many efforts to encourage youth to become their best. So, in 2001, she founded a 501 (c) 3 nonprofit organization entitled, **LEAP Forward**. Her corporation focuses on developing and exposing different math and science career
