


istered Nurse in January '09. I give thanks to you because you were a contributor to help me through college. God is good and you will continue to be blessed for helping people like me and many others to come....

# Congress, Students Find Ways Around High Cost of Textbooks

With the recent passage of the College Opportunity and Affordability Act of 2008 by Congress on July 31, college students can expect a decrease in educational expenses and better accessibility to college.

One of the initiatives involves textbook prices. The cost of text books is at an all-time high and beyond the affordability of many students.

According to a 2005 report by the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO), within the past 20 years textbook prices have tripled, double the general inflation rate for that time span.

The Howard University Bookstore Website shows some of the factors of price increases include "author royalties, publisher costs, marketing, publisher and author taxes, and bookstore expenses." The HUB sets retail prices of text-books based on the industry standard 225 percent margin.

The National Association of College Stores' Student Watch 2008" report said during the 2006-2007 academic year, only 26 percent of students were able to purchase course materials, a large part being textbooks, using grants and scholarships.

With many students left making educational sacrifices, when it comes to textbooks and other materials, some

students have resorted to other outlets to get the materials at a lower cost.

Sophomore nursing major Lynn Pierre buys her books at reasonable prices from her peers. "It's hard for some people to get books," she said.

Some end up with the hassle of sharing books or "may even take their first test without having a book," Pierre said. Madison Mitchell, a junior biology major, mainly exchanges her books with friends or gets them from upperclassmen instead of purchasing them from the bookstore.

"If I do buy a book from the bookstore, it usually pertains to my major," Mitchell said. The GAO report states that the adoption of CD-ROMS and other supplemental materials adds to increases in textbook prices... Under

the legislation, a provision aims to require publishers to offer bundled and unbundled text book versions without withholding their full pricing to bookstores, and to provide student with advance details about textbook prices before semesters begin...In the meantime, students may turn to student—founded resources that offer textbooks at lower prices. One of those, Textbook Pals...helps students save money in the buy-back process.

Launching Educational Assistance Programs Forward, Inc. (LEAP Forward, Inc.) is a non-profit organization that administers the Wallace Leeper Memorial Scholarship and now the Rev. Charles Lee, Sr. Memorial Scholarship.

The <u>Leeper Scholarship</u> will award a one-time book scholarship (minimum \$500.00) to deserving disadvantaged minority students from the local Southern Maryland areas. High school seniors may apply.

The <u>Lee Scholarship</u> will award a one-time \$1000.00 scholarship to deserving disadvantaged minority students from the Washington Metropolitan areas. Current college and

high school students may apply.

Application deadline is April 17, 2009 and awards will be made for the Fall 2009 semester. To be eligible for consideration, the student must:

- Display scholastic, athletic and/or leadership achievement; and
- Be in need of financial assistance (verification may be requested).

<u>Upon notification of the scholarship</u> <u>award, the student must:</u>

- Provide proof of college enrollment, and
- A high school photo (with permission for use in solicitation of future scholarship funding.)

## LEAP Forward now Administers the Rev. Charles H. Lee, Sr. Memorial Scholarship

Reverend Charles H. Lee, Sr. (1928-2007) graduated from Carver High School in Milledgeville, Georgia. He attended Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia and graduated from Texas Southern University in Houston, Texas with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He later received his Bachelor of Divinity and Masters of Theology Degrees from the Interdenominational Theological Seminary in Atlanta, Georgia. As a student, he served as a Methodist Student Organizer and Coordinator at Texas Southern University. Additionally, he was a leader in the First Student Sit-in Demonstration west of the Mississippi and a leader of civil rights groups throughout the southern area of the United States serving as a leader in the Selma to Montgomery march for students at the Interdenominational Theological Center. After the signing of the 1964 Civil Rights Law, he was instrumental with other students during the



summer in integrating eating facilities at Milledgeville State Hospital. Scholastically, Rev. Lee was listed in Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities and was a Crusade Scholar. Rev. Lee served in the United States Army—Europe, Pacific Far East where he served in the Korean Conflict (Private to Captain – Airborne and Infantry); Chaplain (Major) in the California Army National Guard (Retired). Rev. Lee also served as Director of the South East Educational Development (S.E.E.D.) Project for the San Francisco Unified School District. S.E.E.D. was a federally funded program implemented to increase the academic proficiency of inner city children. He has served as Associate Minister of the Trinity Methodist Church, Houston, Texas; Pastor of St. Mary's Methodist Church, League City, Texas; Wesley Methodist Church, Newman, Georgia; Ridge Point United Methodist Church (UMC), San Francisco, California; and, was appointed Pastor of Downs Memorial UMC, Oakland, California in 1971. In 1987, Rev. Lee was appointed as the District Superintendent for the Golden Gate District of the California/Nevada Conference for the UMC which he served until his retirement in 1991.
